

Volunteers (aged 10-60) needed for Research Study into Autism: CAN YOU HELP?

Monash University and the Alfred are currently seeking volunteers for a research study into autism spectrum disorders. To take part, you must have a diagnosis of high-functioning autism or Asperger's disorder and be aged between 10 and 60.

This is a study to investigate sensory processing (hearing, vision, and touch) in ASD. Many people with autism spectrum disorders (ASD) reportedly experience significant difficulties in sensory processing (e.g., sensitivity to noises or lights), but there has been very little research into the cause of these difficulties.

This study involves completing a number of tasks assessing hearing, vision, and touch. Participants will also complete a series of questionnaires and tasks related to ASD and sensory experiences.

This research is being conducted at the Alfred, and involves attending two 2-hour sessions.

Potential participants will be screened prior to their involvement in the study to ensure that they are eligible to take part. Participants will be reimbursed for their time and travel costs.
